


Welcome Message

Professional Support

Professional Officer

The Junior Professional Officer is a full-time, qualified physiotherapist committed to assisting our members with ethical guidelines, policies and procedures, and professional advice. She will gladly assist with any queries or concerns that may arise around HPCSA communications, registrations and rules, promoting of the profession and educating members on professional matters.

Professional Practice Peer Review Committee (PPPRC)

The PPPRC operates under a mandate to assess, educate, and advise members of the SASP on ethical rules and professional conduct. This is achieved through a voluntary peer review process, as well as by responding to enquiries, mediating disputes between members, and assessing complaints involving members or non-members who have agreed to participate in the peer review process.

SASP Professional Development Portfolio

South African Journal of Physiotherapy

Primary authors publishing their research in the SAJP have the publication fee subsidized by the SASP.

This initiative supports and encourages research activity, promotes the dissemination of South African physiotherapy knowledge, and helps make it more accessible for clinicians and academics to contribute to the scientific growth of the profession.

Quality Improvement Committee

The QIC supports the advancement of high-quality, evidence-based physiotherapy in South Africa. Its work includes developing clinical guidelines, promoting the use of standardised assessments, ensuring professional standards in services, marketing materials, endorsed products, and Special Interest Group activities, and supporting advanced professional development. The QIC also collaborates with key SASP portfolios and external stakeholders—such as universities, regulatory bodies, and World Physiotherapy—to strengthen consistency, credibility, and quality across the profession.

National Physiotherapy Educators Forum

The NPEF supports high-quality physiotherapy education across undergraduate, postgraduate, and continuing professional development levels. It promotes lifelong learning, encourages research, and collaborates with key stakeholders—including the Professional Board, the National Department of Health, SIGs, and SASP committees—to strengthen education and professional growth. The NPEF also contributes to the scientific programmes of SASP congresses and symposia.

CPD Accreditation Panel

The CPD Accreditation Panel is mandated to assess and approve CPD activities for the SASP on behalf of the HPCSA, ensuring they align with the scope of physiotherapy, reflect the best available evidence, and support advanced professional development. Its role ensures that members have access to high-quality learning opportunities that strengthen clinical excellence and foster ongoing growth within the profession.

Coding Committee

The SASP Coding Committee develops, maintains, and reviews the physiotherapy coding structure to ensure it aligns with current practice, evidence, and the profession's scope. It collaborates with the HPCSA Professional Board, the NDOH, universities, SIGs, and other SASP structures, and actively contributes to research and assessments related to the implementation of ICD-11, ICF, and ICHI systems for future use in the NHI. The committee also supports members by addressing coding queries, guiding the application of codes in SASP projects and clinical guidelines, and providing education on coding updates.

Specialization

The SASP is actively advocating for the formal recognition of physiotherapy specialisations in South Africa. A dedicated working committee has been established to research all aspects of integrating this proposal within existing educational frameworks and professional expertise. We are also engaging with the HPCSA to guide the future implementation of specialisation recognition, ensuring that members are well-positioned for professional advancement.

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Policy Development and Guidelines

The SASP is continually engaged in developing and refining policies and guidelines to support members in delivering high-quality physiotherapy services and contributing effectively to the profession.

Existing policies are regularly reviewed to ensure they remain current and relevant within the ever-evolving healthcare landscape.

Our guidelines are grounded in evidence-based research and form the backbone of our professional initiatives — from advising members on best practice and advocating for optimal patient care with medical aid funders, to guiding discussions on Universal Healthcare strategies, coding structures, and physiotherapy specialisation. Through this ongoing work, the SASP ensures that its members are equipped, informed, and represented at every level of professional practice.



Interprofessional Rehabilitation Indaba

The IPRI provides a collaborative platform for rehabilitation professionals in South Africa to advocate for stronger rehabilitation services. Through IPRI, SASP members benefit from input into the National Rehabilitation Policy, improved engagement with the Department of Health, representation in the NHI framework, and participation in key projects shaping rehabilitation practice across the country.

National Department of Health



Community Service Support

The Junior Professional Officer, in collaboration with the National Department of Health, organises in-person sessions with fourth-year physiotherapy student groups at each of the eight universities. These sessions are designed to help students prepare for their registration and application for Community Service positions — a process that can often feel unfamiliar and overwhelming. During these visits, we provide clear guidance, answer questions, and offer practical advice to support students as they make important, life-changing decisions about the next stage of their professional journey.
